GUEST SPEAKERS

Auxiliary Bishop Ignatius Wang - born in Beijing, China, he entered the seminary in Hong Kong in 1952 and was ordained a priest on July 4, 1959. Following his ordination, he earned his degree in Canon Law at the Pontifical University in Rome. In 1974, he came to San Francisco after serving in Grenada for 12 years. He became a monsignor in 1989 and the director of the Propagation of the Faith in 1992. In 2000, he was appointed Chancellor and on January 30, 2003, he was installed Auxiliary Bishop at St. Mary's Cathedral in San Francisco. Fr. George E. Mockel - Vicar general and moderator of the curia of the Oakland Diocese. An Oakland native and a graduate of St. Patrick Seminary in Menlo Park; He was ordained to the priesthood in 1975. He previously served as judicial vicar of the diocesan canon law department and was president of the senate of priests. Sunday Mass Celebrant

Fr. Stan Fortuna is one of the eight original members of the Community of Franciscan Friars of the Renewal, a new community established in the Archdiocese of New York in 1987. He is now involved full-time in the preaching apostolate, using his gift of music as a powerful means to reach deep into people's hearts and souls. He established Francesco Productions, a record company, to support their ministry to the poor. Board member and advisor, DMES.





Monsignor James P. Lisante is the director of The Christophers and the host of the award-winning weekly television program "Christopher Closeup". He was ordained in 1981. In 1985, he was appointed director of the Office of Family Ministry for the Diocese of Long Island. He has written many best-selling books. He has syndicated columns on family life and respect for life in Catholic and other Christian newspapers. He is currently the pastor of St. Thomas the Apostle Parish in West Hempstead, New York. Fr. Michael Barry, SS,CC is a Provincial of the Western Province of the Sacred Heart Fathers. He was ordained a priest in 1964. He became the Diocesan Director of the Charismatic Renewal for the Diocese of San Bernardino in 1980. He opened Mary's Table which provides food for the poor and Veronica's Home, a shelter for the single pregnant women. Board member and advisor, DMES



Fr. Donald Calloway, M.I.C. a convert to Catholicism, is a member of the Congregation of Marians of the Immaculate Conception. Before his conversion, he lived for wine, women and song. He was jailed three times, kicked out of a foreign country, and was twice institutionalized. At age 20 he read a book about Medjugorje that radically changed his life. He entered the priesthood and has earned a B.A. in Philosophy and Theology from the Franciscan University of Steubenville. He is currently the House Superior of the Marian House of Studies in Steubenville, Ohio.



Salvatore Caruso, AIA, a native San Josean, is the current chairman of the Santa Clara County Province of Florence Sister County Commission and president of the Italian American Heritage Foundation. He went to the Institute of Architecture in Palermo, Italy where he completed the basic architecture program, with minors in engineering and surveying.

Two of his many projects that are close to his heart are directly connected to his Catholic faith. One is the renovation of Our Lady of Guadalupe Church and the work he did for the Poor Clare Monastery in Los Altos Hills. Not only did he do the architectural work, he assisted in raising millions of dollars in contributions for the \$3M project. Arch. Caruso heads Salvatore Caruso Design Corporation. He is the Architect of DM Shrine Project and VP of DMES. Emcee



Fr. Joseph Whalen, M. S. was born in Quincy Massachusetts and received his call to the priesthood late in life. He entered Pope John XXIII Seminary, a seminary for delayed vocations, and completed four years of advanced graduate studies. On Sept. 9, 1989, at the age of 66, he was ordained Roman Catholic priest by Bishop Alfred Hughes and became La Salette Missionary. He is

presently assigned to St. James Church in Danielson, CT. His ministries are many and he is a champion of the sick, the elderly, drug addicts, alcoholics, families and those in need. Fr. Whalen conducts many healing services and his St. Raphael healing Ministry has become worldwide.

Fr. Piotr Prusakiewicz, CSMA - born in Torun, Poland, he was ordained in the Congregation of St. Michael the Archangel on May 26, 1990. For 4 years he was the chaplain of the Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy in Warsaw where Saint Sr. Faustina entered the congregation and spent some time. He was a member of the General Council of Congregation of Saint Michael the Archangel, Marki from 1998 to 2004. Chief Editor of "Who is like God" a magazine on angels. Fr. Piotr is an international speaker and a veteran speaker at conferences and retreats on Divine Mercy, with speaking engagements in countries like Poland, Australia, England, Scotland, Spain, Italy, Germany, Arabic Emirates, Singapore, Papua New Guinea, and Gibraltar.

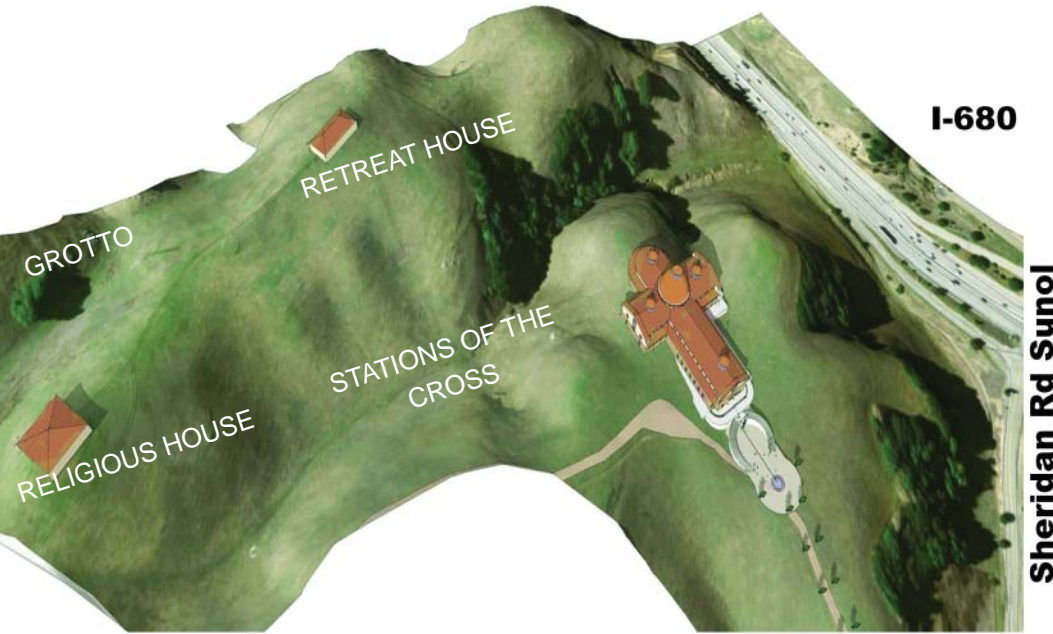

DIVINE MERCY SHRINE OF THE WEST COAST- CROSS VIEW



- The white shade around the church is the landing; the black shade are steps to the Church entrance; ramps for handicapped provided
- Two side chapels: one for the Byzantine priests.
- The walkway from the entrance gate (Sheridan Road), to the Church will have trees as “Our Father” beads, and the rows of 10 rose trees as “Hail Mary” beads to form the 20 decades of the Holy Rosary.
- Statue of Divine Mercy on the highest hill (westside of retreat house); Grotto of the Blessed Mother on top of the hill above Retreat House
- The Crucifix will have waterfalls at the back; waters from the left and right sides of the falls will be flowing to the middle foot of the cross going to the pool in the middle of the plaza. The waterfalls will be cascading on red stones on the left and white stones on the right.

TRAVEL ITINERARY APRIL 4-17, 2007
MEDJUGORJE, POLAND & CENTRAL EUROPE

APRIL 4, ARRIVAL

Upon your arrival in Split or Dubrovnik, Croatia transfer to your hotel in Medjugorje for four (4) overnight-accommodation commencing with dinner.

APRIL 5 - 7, MEDJUGORJE, HOLY WEEK RETREAT

After morning Mass at St James Parish Church, climb the Apparition Hill, Podbrdo, where Mary first appeared. Afternoons each day will be free for several options. If possible, you will visit Fr. Jozo Zovko, the Franciscan Priest who was the pastor of St. James Church at the time Our Lady first appeared in Medjugorje in 1981. Our guide will arrange meetings with the visionaries, if possible. Visit the Oasis of Pace which has 24-hour adoration chapel. Continue on to the community of Cenacolo. We will have the opportunity to climb Krizevac Mountain, where in 1933 the villagers built a 30 ft. high cross on the anniversary of Jesus' crucifixion. Visit and pray at "Blue Cross", which is a place of great healings and graces- a very special place at the base of Apparition Hill. Between 5-6pm daily you may join the villagers and pilgrims in the recitation of the Rosary. Each evening you may also join the local parish community at Mass with prayers for the sick, recitation of the Rosary and blessing of articles.

APRIL 8, EASTER SUNDAY

After an Easter Sunday morning Mass in Medjugorje, drive along the most beautiful part of the Adriatic coastline "Makarska Riviera". Relax by the Adriatic Sea before dinner and overnight in the area of Zadar.

APRIL 9, MARIJA BISTRICA - NATIONAL CROATIAN SHRINE

Transfer to Marija Bistrica, National, Marian shrine of the Croatian people. Stop enroute in the Cathedral of Zagreb, prayer by the tomb of Blessed Cardinal Alojzije Stepinac, martyr of communism beatified by John Paul II in 1998. Afternoon Mass at the Basilica of Marija Bistrica, dinner and overnight.

APRIL 10, MARIAZELL - ALPINE SHRINE OF OUR LADY

After morning Mass head for the Austrian border to Mariazell, the Shrine of Great Mother of Austria and Slavic People. Dinner and overnight in the picturesque Mariazell where you can enjoy the Alpine scenery.

APRIL 11, MARIA DREIECHEN - VIENNA - EUROPE SAVED FROM ISLAM

Morning Mass in Mariazell. Continue on through the lush Austrian countryside to Maria Dreieichen, the pilgrimage site in the area of Vienna. Stop enroute St. Joseph Church, rich in religious and historical importance, sitting atop Kalenberg Hill, where joined Catholic army defeated Turks and saved Europe from Islam in 1683 at the Battle of Vienna. Dinner and overnight in Maria Dreieichen.

APRIL 12, POLAND - HOMELAND OF JOHN PAUL II

OCT 8

Board a transatlantic flight bound for Madrid. Dinner served on board.

OCT 9

On arrival transfer by private motor coach to hotel in Madrid for dinner and overnight.

OCT 10, Madrid - Avila

Morning sightseeing of Madrid concluded with Mass celebrated at the Cathedral. In the afternoon, transfer to the hotel in the area of Avila for two (2) overnight accommodation.

OCT 11, Avila

Today's tour of Avila includes Morning Mass at Convent of St. Teresa, the birthplace of the great mystic and the first woman to be named a Doctor of the Church. We will also visit the Monastery of the Incarnation - a Carmelite convent where St Teresa remained for 30 years. Afternoon at leisure in Avila. Return to our hotel for dinner and overnight.

OCT 12, Fatima

Continue your journey to Fatima, Portugal, where the Blessed Mother appeared in 1917 to three simple shepherd children. After dinner and settling into your hotel, you may relax or participate in a celebration of the 12th Fatima Feast, which includes the International Rosary in the Capelinia, Candlelight Procession and Concelebration of the Eucharist at the outdoor altar.

OCT 13, Our Lady of Fatima Feast

After morning Mass, transfer to Saragossa, where St James had a vision of Our Lady standing on the pillar encouraging him to continue his apostolic mission in Spain. Guided tour of the city includes Plaza del Pilar and the spectacular La Seo. Dinner and overnight in Saragossa.

OCT 20, Montserrat

After morning Mass, drive to Montserrat, Spain, Catalonia's most important shrine, where the Black Virgin is venerated since medieval ages. Dinner and overnight in Montserrat.

OCT 21, Barcelona

After morning Mass drive to Barcelona for a guided tour of the capitol of Catalonia, Spain's most cosmopolitan city.
